THE 2017 AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL ARABIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS YOUTH SECTION RULES AND CONDITIONS

ANY PERSON ENTERING A HORSE IN THE CHAMPIONSHIPS MUST BE THE REGISTERED OWNER OF THE HORSE AND A CURRENT FINANCIAL MEMBER OF THE ARABIAN HORSE SOCIETY OF AUSTRALIA LTD.

The Australian Arabian National Championships Youth Section (herein called "Championships") is a precursor to an annual exhibition and competition of Youth and the Arabian, Arabian Derivative and Arabian Performance Register horses registered with the Arabian Horse Society of Australia Limited (herein called "the Society").

The 2017 Australian Arabian National Championships Youth Section is conducted in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Arabian Horse Society of Australia Ltd. Competitors are responsible for becoming familiar with all sections of these Rules as they form a part of the conditions of Entry for the Championships. Copies of the most current rules can be downloaded from the AHSA website: www.ahsa.asn.au

These Rules & Conditions are valid and up-to-date at the time of publication; all Rules & Conditions are subject to minor changes prior to actual event dates. The Rules and Conditions by which the Championships will be conducted are those printed below.

EVERY PERSON HANDLING A HORSE IN ANY CAPACITY AT THIS EVENT MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE AHSA OR AN AHSA AFFILIATE. IF YOU ARE NEITHER, PLEASE GO TO <http://ahsa.asn.au/ahsa-forms> AND BECOME A PARTICIPANT MEMBER OF THE AHSA (COST \$30). PARTICIPANTS MUST WEAR A WRIST BAND FOR THE DURATION OF THE EVENT.

NOTE: Venue rules must be adhered to at all times.

1. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- a. Entries are subject to these Rules and Conditions and those of the current AHSA Rule Book, the Rules and Conditions if any, appearing on the Entry Form and to the formal Instructions to Competitors, Judges, Marshals and Stewards and to any other verbal or written instructions issued to competitors, judges, marshals or stewards prior to or during the course of the Championships.
- b. Entries will not be processed until payment has been received. No exceptions. Credit Card details may be listed on entry forms.
- c. Any refund of entry fees will be at the discretion of the committee by written request received prior to the show, tabled at the full Board meeting following the show and subject to fees and charges. This excludes classes/championships that may be combined; full entry fees will still apply.
- d. The Championships Committee shall have the power without assigning any reason therefore to:
 - i. Reject or cancel an entry at any time.
 - ii. Prohibit the participation of any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered.
 - iii. Cancel, divide and/or combine any event or class.
 - iv. Alter the time and day at which any class or event is to take place.
 - v. Order the removal of any exhibitor, spectator or exhibit from the Showground.
 - vi. Transfer an exhibit from any class to any other class.
 - vii. Invoke Clauses (a), (b) and (f) above on receipt of a report to the PROTEST AND

2. APPEALS COMMITTEE of any practice which appears to constitute an act of cruelty. Such reports must be in writing and be accompanied by a fee of \$100, which will be refunded unless the report is deemed frivolous
3. Exhibits with a PIC (Property Identification Code) number issued by Biosecurity Queensland or New South Wales are required to list this ID on the Entry Form.
4. All exhibitors will be required to complete an AHSA Health Declaration Form upon arrival at the Event Office.
5. Unloading of horses and assignment of stables may be contingent to submission to and approval of Event Staff.
6. ANY EXHIBITOR when called upon to do so by any Steward or Official of the Committee shall produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Committee as to the correctness of the description and particulars contained in the Exhibitor's certificate of entry in relation to any particular exhibit.

7. EVERY EXHIBITOR shall be deemed to have guaranteed the correctness of the contents of every certificate submitted by the exhibitor or on the exhibitor's behalf. Entries of horses not yet registered or transferred with the AHSA will be rejected.
8. ANY CHEQUE or negotiable instrument received or accepted by the Society or Show Committee shall be deemed to have been received as a conditional payment only and subject to payment upon presentation. Any bank fees incurred as a result of a declined payment shall be borne by the competitor.
9. Upon the disqualification of any exhibit under any of the Rules, the Committee reserves the right to amend any placing and/or awards. Should any prize winning exhibit be disqualified, subsequent entries do not necessarily obtain their placing. The Championships Committee shall decide upon final outcome after consultation with the Judges.

10. EXHIBIT NUMBERS & CATALOGUES

- (a) Must be collected from the Show Office.
- (b) Correct numbers are to be worn around the neck of the exhibit, or around the waist or on the back of the handler or rider during each class. Exhibits displaying the incorrect number and/or failing to wear any number may be excluded from competing in a Championship.
- (c) Exhibits not complying with this rule may not be judged.
- (d) Each exhibit shall display the same exhibit number in all events it contests.

11. LIABILITY REQUIREMENTS

- (a) Every person handling, riding, driving, training, grooming or preparing a horse/pony must be a current financial member of the AHSA or an AHSA Affiliate.
- (b) Proof of Membership should be lodged to the Show Committee with entries to enable correct allocations of wrist bands.
- (c) Any person found to be handling any horse who is not wearing their wrist band will face disciplinary action.
- (d) No person, under any circumstances, will be allowed to enter the ring without their wrist band.

12 PROHIBITED APPARATUS – Please refer to the current AHSA Rule Book.

13 PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

- (a) Any Official may upon any part of the grounds upon which the Championships are being conducted and at any time during the duration of the Championships make or cause to be made any test of any horse to determine whether any prohibited substance has been administered to such horse and may take possession of any such horse for any of the aforesaid purposes and detain such exhibit for such period as is deemed necessary. For the purpose of this rule, the exhibitor hereby irrevocably authorises such Official to take and retain possession of the said horse for the aforesaid purpose.
- (b) Any horse presented for competition in any show conducted by/for the Society or an Affiliate of the Society which returns a positive reading to a prohibited substance shall be deemed to have had that prohibited substance administered to it and may be disqualified and in the event of such disqualification shall forfeit any awards gained from any event or class for or in which it has been entered or competed. In addition, the owner/lessee or the person who had charge of the horse may be dealt with in accordance with the current AHSA Rule Book, including, but not limited to, financial and/or eligibility penalties.
- (c) Please refer to the current AHSA Rule Book or the FEI List of Prohibited Substances: www.fei.org.

- 14 RESPONSIBILITY - Neither the Society nor the Committee shall be liable to any person in case of loss or damage by reason of any defect, accident, negligence or neglect, however arising.

- 15 ACCIDENT AND OR INJURY: ALL accidents or injuries to horses MUST be reported to the Show Manager immediately.

16 HEIGHT CERTIFICATES

- (a) all entries aged Three & Over entered in classes in which height at withers is a condition of entry, must be measured by the official Measuring Steward at least two hours prior to the start of the class, or submit a valid Height Certificate acceptable to Show Management (EA, SHC or Royal Show certified) with entries / upon check-in.
- (b) all Valid Height Certificates, excluding official Lifetime Height Certificates, must have been issued in the last twelve (12) months.
- (c) valid height certificate must be available upon request at all times.

17 CONDUCT OF EXHIBITS AND EXHIBITORS

- (a) Please refer Rule 8 of the current AHSA Rule Book. Where a person is concerned, please refer to 8.4 of the current AHSA Rule Book.
- (b) CODE OF BEHAVIOUR CARD SYSTEM: Please refer Rule 9.5 of the current AHSA Rule Book.

18 DEFINITIONS

- a) "OFFICIAL" means any person or persons appointed by the Society for the purposes of carrying out any function under these Rules and Conditions. This shall include any member of the Championships Committee and any Steward appointed by the Championships Committee.
- b) "PROTEST AND APPEALS COMMITTEE" - the Protest and Appeals Committee shall be the Committee appointed by the Society. No member of the Protest and Appeals Committee may hear a protest in the section of the Championships in which he is exhibiting or competing.
- c) "DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE" – the Disciplinary Committee shall be the Committee appointed by the Society. It will consist of the Chairman of the Society, the Chairman of the Championships, the Senior Vice Chairman of the Society and one other Board member of the Society.
- d) For further definitions refer to the AHSA RuleBook.

19. QUALIFICATIONS YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

- (a) Qualifications for Youth competitors may be gained by participating in any similar event at a show in the preceding twelve (12) months.
- (b) Age of Youth Exhibitor shall be determined by actual age according to date of birth on each show day of the Championships. Proof of age may be required.
- (c) All exhibits shown by a Youth exhibitor must be four (4) years of age and older.
- (d) Youth exhibits must only be mares or geldings. Stallions are not permitted to be exhibited by a Youth either in-hand or under saddle.
- (e) Arabian/Arabian Derivative Lead Line Rider
 - a. No qualifications required
 - b. Rider competing in this class are ineligible for any other rider class,
 - c. Rider must be aged at least five (5) and no older than eight (8) years of age by show date.
 - d. Exhibit may compete in any other class with another rider.

20. GENERAL

- (a) The Championships will be conducted and classes shall be adjudicated in accordance with the current Rules of the A.H.S.A. Ltd. in force and published at the time of the Championships, on the website www.ahsa.asn.au and the Championship Rules as printed here. In case of any conflict between the last-mentioned rules and these Championship Rules and Conditions, the latter shall prevail.
- (b) The Show Committee, after receiving ratification by the AHSA, reserves the right to adjust the Championships schedule, to remove, replace or reallocate judges and/or judging assignments, as well as to split, combine, add and/or remove classes and/or divisions at any time prior to or during the Event. Written notice, either posted on the event website or posted onsite in the Show Office, will be provided to exhibitors of all such changes and modifications.
- (c) The Show Committee, after receiving ratification by the AHSA, reserves the right to adjust and/or modify the allocation of awards to each division and/or breed section according to number of entries from the current Event or based on past Events.

21. COMMERCIAL DISPLAYS

- (a) No commercial display of any product or service is permitted at any time or anywhere upon the showgrounds including stabling areas without the written permission of the Society or show Committee.

- (b) Commercial display includes signs in any form. This does not apply to exhibitor stud or trainer promotion.
22. NOTIFIABLE DISEASE OUTBREAKS: Infectious diseases such as Hendra Virus and Equine Influenza are notifiable by law. The AHSA in conjunction with the venue have formulated a Biosecurity Plan for the protection of horses and people. We are not expecting any outbreaks nor have there been any issues within the area however you are reminded that any sick horse should NOT leave your property and should not be brought to the event. The Show Committee assigns stables to competitors which cannot be altered without consent from your assigned Stable Warden. The primary responsibility for biosecurity at events lies with the horse owners, riders and trainers well before the event. Owners and those providing agistment and/or training for horses should have their own biosecurity plans on properties where horses are kept. Information for horse owners is available on the websites of the CSIRO and the Department of Primary Industries.
23. PERFORMANCE CHAMPIONSHIPWORKOUTS & AWARDS
- (a) Individual workouts shall be given for all exhibits in all National Performance Championships, with the exception of Bridle Path Hack, Western Pleasure, Native Costume and Show Costume.
24. PROTEST AND APPEALS – Refer to the most current AHSA Rule Book or visit website: www.ahsa.asn.au.
25. STABLING OF EXHIBITS
- (a) Priority stabling and camping preference will be given to Major sponsors, Distance traveled and number of days in attendance.
- (b) NO REQUESTS – Competitors wishing to be stabled and or camped together MUST organize between themselves and have ALL stabling on ONE entry form.
- (c) Upon entry to K Ranch, each exhibit, for which stabling has been paid assigned, must at once be stabled in the allocated stable(s) as designated by the Show Organiser and/or Stable Monitor.
- (d) No exhibit may at any time occupy any other stable other than the one which has been allocated to it by the Show Organiser and/or Stable Monitor for the entire period of the show.
- (e) No exhibitor shall be deemed to have any right, whether by way of occupation or otherwise, to any stall or portion of the showground allotted to him from time to time by the Show committee, and he shall forthwith vacate same upon being requested to do so by an Official of the Society or Show Committee.
- (f) All stabling assignments are made at the sole discretion of the Championships Committee in assistance with the Stable Monitor.
- (g) No exhibitor, stud owner, agent, sponsor or any person will be permitted to obstruct any stable aisle, doorway or thoroughfare.

YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS SPECIFIC RULES

All youths attending the event must be under supervision of a parent or guardian at all times.

Current standard approved safety helmets are to be worn for all mounted events.

26. AWARDS
- (a) All classes, unless otherwise stated shall be judged comparatively. Nominated classes shall be judged numerically.
- (b) All classes shall place first to fourth.
- (c) Champions shall be taken from first place getters in each section.
- (d) Reserve Champions shall be taken from the remaining first place getters, plus the second place getters to the champion.
- (e) Gold champions shall be taken from the champions in each section.
- (f) Silver champions shall be taken from the remaining champions of the section, plus the reserve champion to the winning champion.
- (g) Bronze champions shall be taken from the remaining champions and reserve.
27. HIGH POINT AWARDS
- 1) High point awards will be awarded in each age group. Competitors shall receive one point for every class they compete in.
- 2) Further points shall be awarded as follows:
- (a) Four points for a first place.
- (b) Three points for a second place.

- (c) Two points for a third place.
- (d) One point for a fourth place. In addition,
- (e) Three points for a champion.
- (f) Two points for a reserve champion. In addition,
- (g) Five points for a gold champion.
- (h) Four points for a silver champion
- (i) Three points for a bronze champion

NOTE: a gold champion winner shall have accumulated thirteen points.
 High point award winners in each age group shall receive prizes to be announced.

28. CHILDS HACK

The Childs Hack is to be presented and judged as a Hack class with points given to the rider. A Childs Hack is a pony or horse showing manners and paces suitable for a child's first/early mount. Providing the rider confidence and ease of riding.

- (a) Rules and class procedure as per Hack Classes in the current AHSA Rule Book **WITH THE FOLLOW CHANGES**
- (b) Snaffle, Double or Bradoon bridle optional, however, emphasis will be on the correct use of the bridle
- (c) To be scored as follows: - 20 points each for 1. Manners 2. Paces 3. Confirmation & soundness 4. Education 5. Rider
- (d) Tied scores will be broken by the highest score for 1. and then 2, 3, 4, 5 if necessary

29. WORKING HUNTER

The working hunter is a horse that in addition to the qualities of a show hunter has the ability to jump natural fences. Horses are scored on Conformation, Flatwork and Jumping.

Conformation – The judge will assess each horse keeping in mind the characteristics required in a true hunter type – 20 points

Flatwork - The hunter is to be more free flowing, have good manners and easy flowing paces. The hunter should move forward into the bridle with being heavy in the hand. 30 points

Jumping – A course of 8 obstacles is to be jumped. 4 Obstacles may be used and jumped twice. Consideration is given to manners, style, pace and control while jumping. 50 points

- (a) Points will be deducted for – 1st Rail down or refusal 10 points, 2nd Rail down or refusal 20 points, 3rd rail down or refusal – Elimination
- (b) Maximum height of jumps to be 60cms and where possible of natural appearance. If not rails are permitted.
- (c) Turnout as for hunter class (refer AHSA rule book) however an all-purpose or jumping saddle can be worn
- (d) To be ridden in a simple snaffle, Double or Pelham with either double or split reins
- (e) Whips must be maximum length of 75cm
- (f) No side reins or running reins however running martingale is permitted
- (g) Protective boots are permissible for the ridden stage
- (h) Safety approved helmet must be worn.
- (i) A fall or horse and/or rider or leaving the ring during the workout will be elimination.

DIAGRAMS – APPENDIX 1

30. BENDING RACE

- (a) The course will consist of five (5) pegs spaced 5.5 m apart.
- (b) The start and finish line will be 8.2 m from the first peg.
- (c) The spacing between lines of pegs is to be 11 m.
- (d) The boundary line at the end of the row of pegs will be 5.5 m from the last peg.

- (e) There is no limit to the number of lines of pegs to be used.
- (f) The position of each peg, and the lane boundaries will be marked.
- (g) Competitors must start on the left hand side of the first peg, and bend alternatively right then left through the pegs. The turn at the farthest peg is to the right.
- (h) Elimination is incurred for the following:
 - i. Knocked down or broken peg
 - ii. Missing a peg and not correcting course
 - iii. Hoof over or on the line marking the lanes, boundary, start and finish lines.
 - iv. Knock down of a start/finish peg.
 - v. Fall of horse or rider

DIAGRAM – APPENDIX 2

31. FLAG RACE

- (a) The course will consist of five (5) pegs spaced 5.5 metres apart.
- (b) The cask will be 8.2 m from the first peg. The cask or other suitable container should be the size of a 20 litre drum attached to a peg similar to the ones used in the row of pegs for the competition but may be up to 40mm diameter. Base to be a similar size to a 20l drum and up to 200mm deep. The cask may be a bag with the same size opening as a 20 litre drum with bag attached or the catching area of a basket ball ring.
- (c) The spacing between the lines of pegs is to be 11 metres. There is no limit to the number of lines of pegs used.
- (d) The boundary line at the end of the row of pegs will be 5.5 m from the last peg.
- (e) The position of each peg and the lane boundaries will be marked, including the start and finish line.
- (f) The start and finish line will be 5.5 m from the cask and clear of the outside lines.
- (g) Flags to be a piece of suitable wire with a finished length of 225 mm, with the top turned over and a coloured bunting type flag fastened to the turned over section.
- (h) Competitors start on the left hand side of the cask, and turn their horses on the off side rein.
- (i) The farthest flag must be picked up first, and then the second farthest and continue in this order.
- (j) If a peg falls but the rider has the flag there is no penalty.
- (k) Competitors must place each flag in the cask before the next flag is picked up.
- (l) If a flag is dropped the rider is eliminated
- (m) Fall of horse or rider entails elimination
- (n) Knock down of a start/finish peg, or flag container, incurs elimination.
- (o) At the end of the flag race, the cask holding the flags must be standing.
- (p) A hoof on or over the line marking the boundaries, (i.e.all four lines), incurs elimination.

DIAGRAM – APPENDIX 3

32. SNAKES AND LADDERS

- (a) Equipment required:
 - Six jump rails of minimum 75mm thickness. Cavaletti not to be used.
 - Twelve 20 litre drums or jumping blocks
 - One peg for turning
 - Start and Finish pegs
- (b) Setting the Course:
 - The position of each 20 litre drum/jumping block and peg to be marked.
 - All hurdles to be set at the same height and height of each hurdle not to exceed 30cm.
 - Start and Finish pegs 4.5m from first hurdle
 - Six hurdles to be placed in a straight line, and set at 3.3m apart.
 - One peg placed 5.4m beyond the third hurdle, placed in the middle of the line of travel.

5.4m beyond the last hurdle place the turning peg in the middle of the line of travel

- (c) Competition:
Competitor may have a flying start from the 6 metre line.

Bend through the rails, with first rail being a right hand

A right hand turn around the top peg.

Straight home over the hurdles.

- (d) Eliminations:
- i. Knocks down a hurdle
 - ii. Turns tail or runs out on a hurdle 3 times during the course.
 - iii. By passes a hurdle and does not retake it or spreads any two or more hurdles.
 - iv. Knocks down or breaks pegs.
 - v. Error of course not rectified
 - vi. Touching of a peg with the hand
 - vii. NB. Showjumping rules do not apply in this event.
 - viii Fall of horse or rider

33. RUNNING T

- (a) Course as shown **DIAGRAM – APPENDIX 5**
- (b) Distances as shown on diagram.
- (c) Elimination:
 - i. Error of course not rectified
 - ii. Knocked down or broken peg
 - iii. Knock down of a start/finish peg
 - iv. Fall of horse or rider

30. BARREL RACE

- (a) Barrel distances are as shown on the diagram. Where distances must be reduced to suit the arena, barrels must be at least 5 m from the fence.
- (b) The outside edge of the barrel will touch the measured spot in order that the horse will be required to travel only the measured distance.
- (c) Barrels are to be 200 litre size drums. Tyres or covers optional.
- (d) Riders may go to either right or left barrel first, but must make two left and turns and one right turn, or two right turns and one left turn.
- (e) The starting and finishing line and the position of the barrels must be marked permanently for the entire fixture.
- (f) A five (5) second penalty will be added for each barrel knocked over.
- (g) The judge and timer must stand on the start line. Timers are to remain unchanged throughout the competition, except for illness or injury.
- (h) Horses may have a flying start from the 6 Metre Line after correctly entering the start area.
- (i) Disqualification will result from: i. Not following the prescribed pattern ii. Touching a barrel with the hand. iii. Knock down of a start/finish peg.

- (j) Wrong course
- (k) Fall of horse or rider

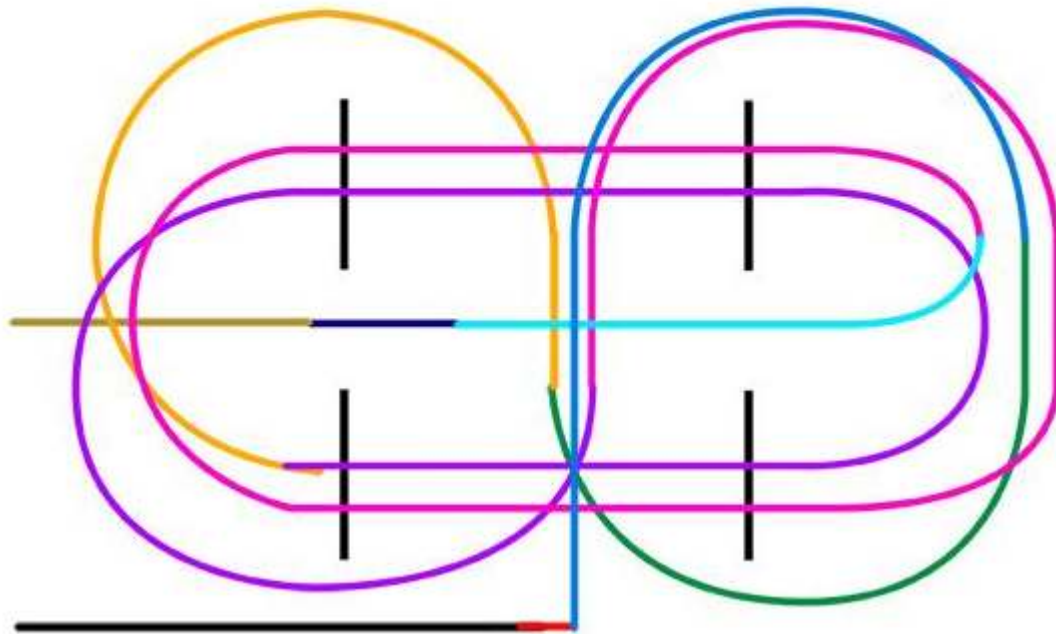

- (d) PENALTIES - Not starting & Finishing through the Start/finish pegs, incorrect course, dropping flag DISQUALIFICATION

If the flag bucket is knocked off before the flag is picked up or replaced rider will be DISQUALIFIED.

Falling of horse and/or rider DISQUALIFIED

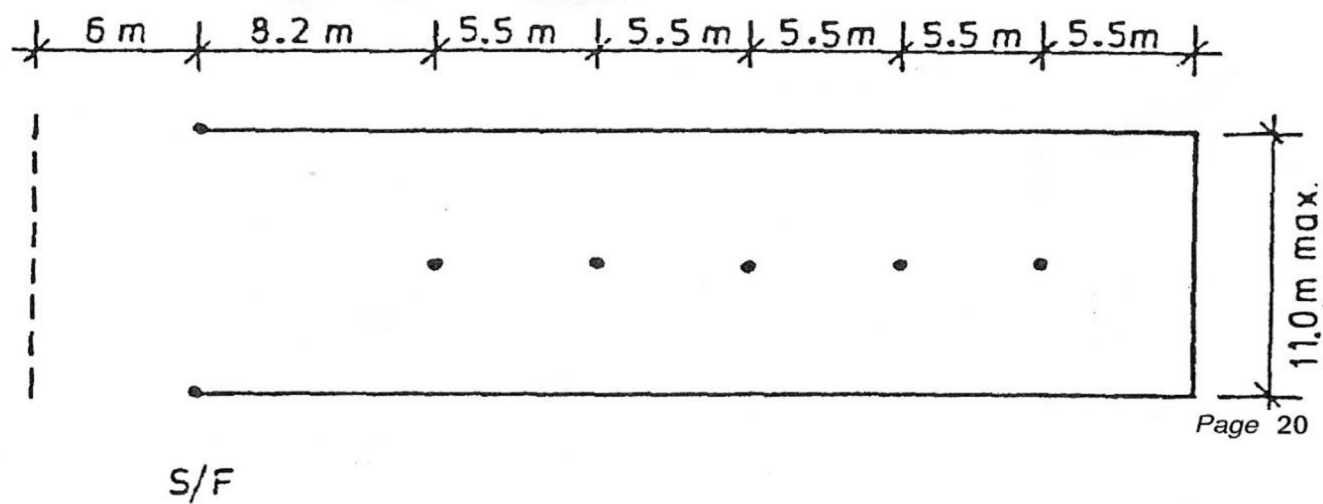

Working Hunter

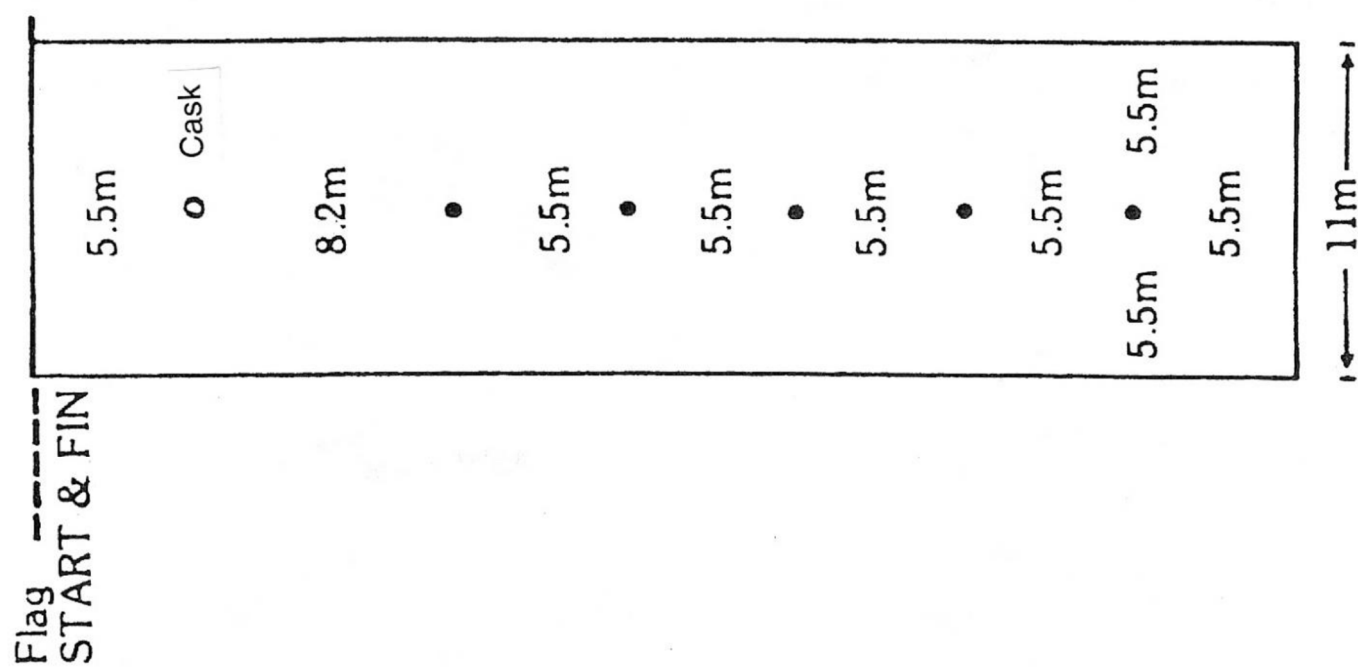


1. Enter Trot

10. Walk - Leave arena loose rein

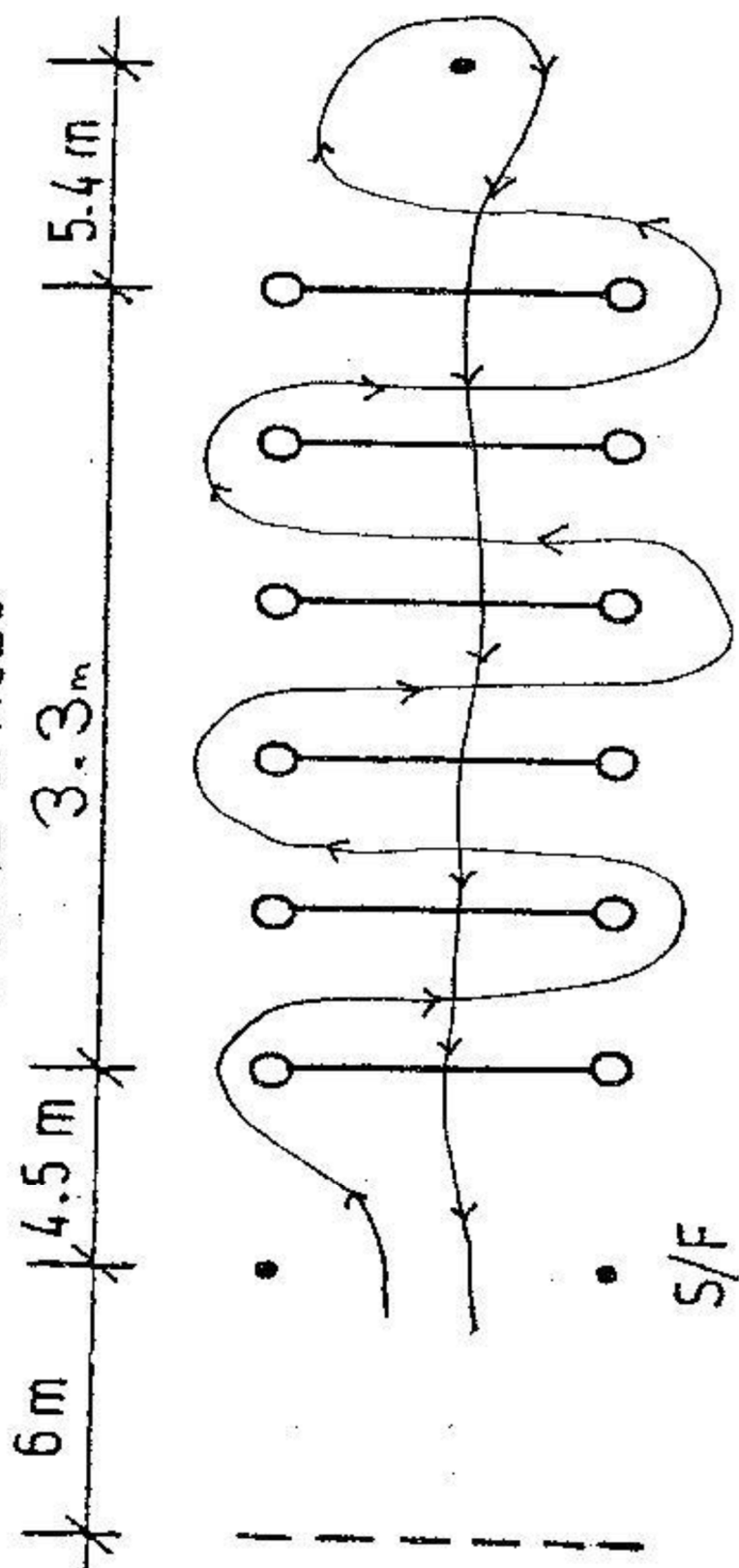
APPENDIX 2 - BENDING RACE



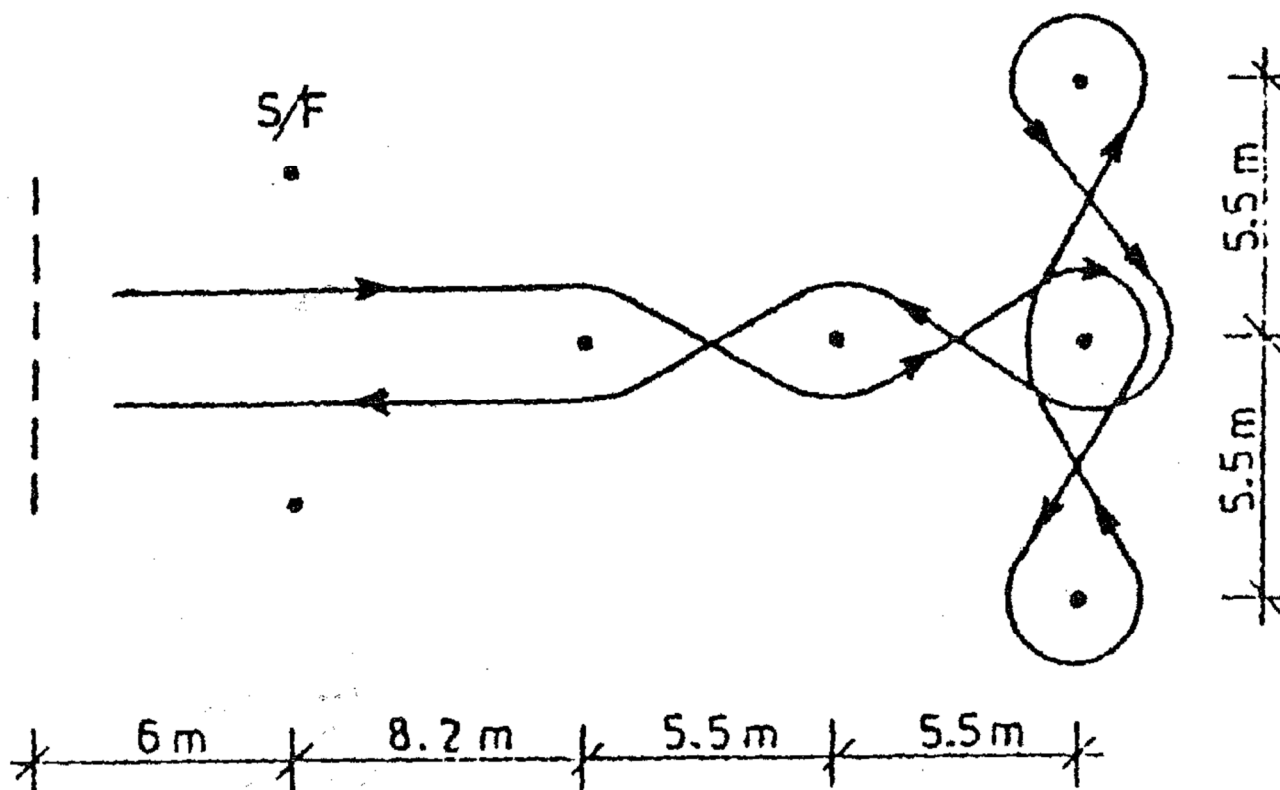
APPENDIX 3 - FLAG RACE



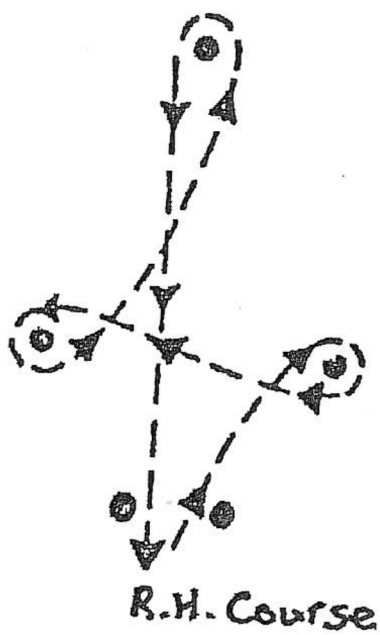
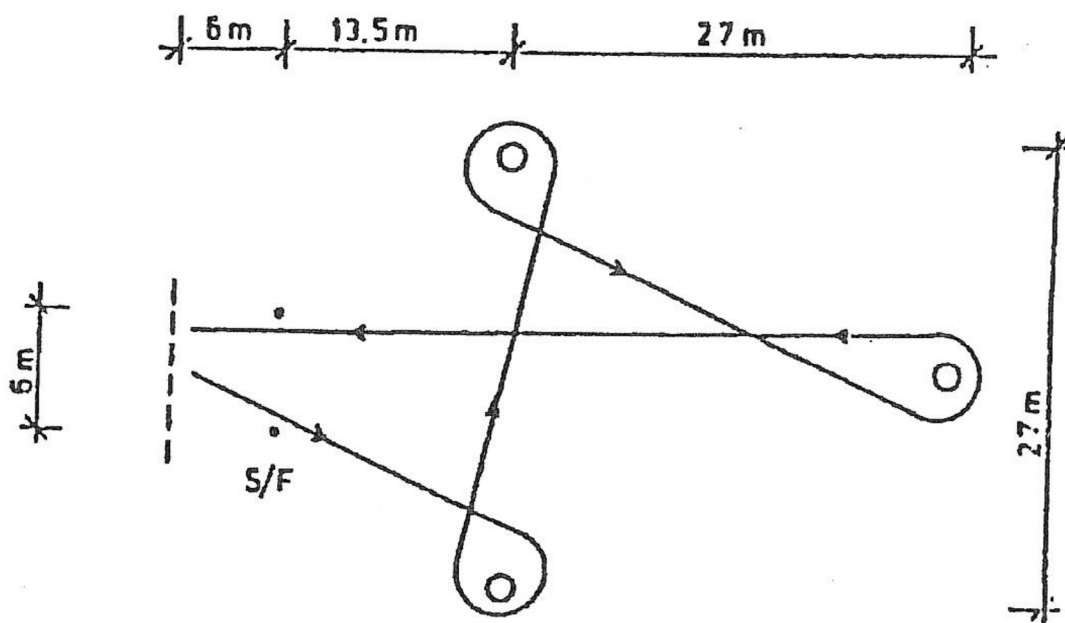

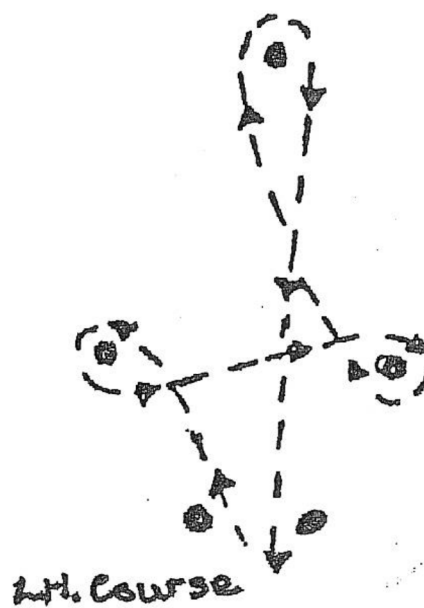
APPENDIX 5 – RUNNING TEE



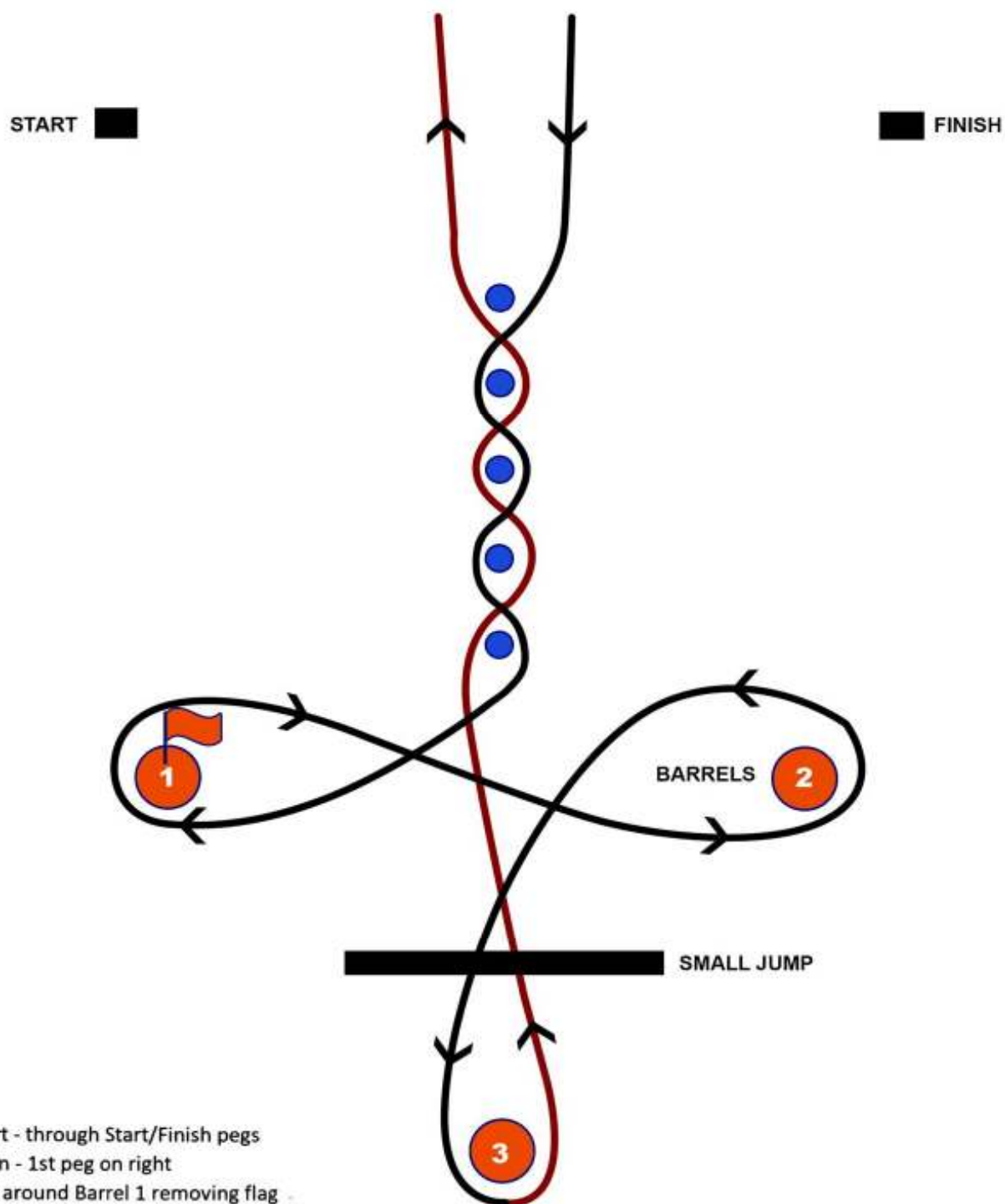
